We will conclude with a wood turned item gift exchange for those that want to participate. This meeting has something for everyone. More on these events from Jeff and Roy in this months newsletter.

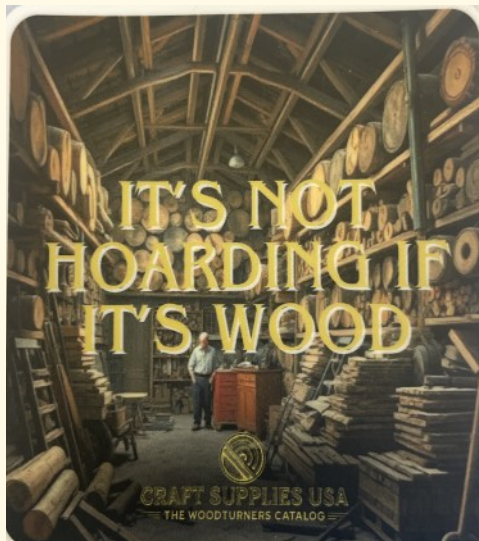

-Parameters:

-Bowl Diameter: Outside bowl diameter no restriction, inside diameter between 5 1/2 inches—6 inches. Rims, no restriction, Height, no restriction Embellishment encouraged (extra points). Bowl design/shape, and its finish to be judged. **It must function as a cereal bowl.**



We will have some prizes and lots of fun. Need some ideas; do an internet search i.e., wood turned cereal bowls....lots of ideas. Good Luck!

P.S. Cereal not required!

3. **Turning Tops:** We will be setting up a couple of lathes to turn tops. Each top turned, earns a drawing ticket toward a prize. This Month's TAV Update:

By the time that you are reading this, Memorial Day is already in the rear-view mirror. The holiday is intended to remind us of the sacrifices our service members have made. All gave some, some gave all. TAV is an opportunity to give back to some of those individuals. Volunteer to help at one of the four TAV sites. You get to practice a craft that we all love, and at the same time, we help veterans and staff at the TAV locations. The site leads will provide mentorship as required. TAV would not be possible without the support of our volunteers and donors. Please consider volunteering at one of the TAV sites—you'll find it a deeply fulfilling experience. If volunteering isn't an option, donations are always appreciated. I am currently volunteering at NMC Balboa and have recently visited ASPIRE and Camp Pendleton. I'll also be visiting the VA soon.

ASPIRE Center

The site lead at ASPIRE is Brian Saunders. ASPIRE is a residential facility where participants stay for several months, and during that time, we make a lot of pens—primarily Slimlines with impressively creative designs. Participants also craft weed pots, bowls, ice cream scoops, and other items, with several individuals developing remarkable skills. One participant will be graduating next week and will receive a mini lathe, tools, and essential supplies. They will remain in San Diego, and we encourage them to join SDWT.

TAV sessions at ASPIRE take place every Wednesday morning from 8:15-12:15 and are supported by a small but highly dedicated group of SDWT volunteers. In addition to mentoring participants, we are continually working to improve the program. We have standardized our sharpening process using Glenn Lucas's recommendations for the Wolverine System. New jigs have been purchased, story sticks created, and we are standardizing chucks while expanding our selection of jaws. We're looking forward to a productive and successful year.

Volunteering truly is a rewarding experience, and we encourage you to join us.

Camp Pendleton

The site lead at Camp Pendleton is Jon Chernow. The program currently has eight volunteers. While the population in the Wounded Warriors barracks is relatively low, Wednesday sessions (9:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m.) average about twelve participants, ranging from privates to senior officers. This week, Jon received the news that Fred Thompson (NOT Fred Wilson) passed away the other day. Fred was a former SEABEE and a devoted member of the Camp Pendleton TAV contingent during the Nan Bushley and Tom Lightner days. After he was unable to participate, he stayed in touch and supplied us with countless bowl and pen blanks throughout last year. He will be missed and never forgotten. More information should be coming soon via the club.

NMC Balboa (Navy Medical Center)

The Del Mar Fair for 2026 is almost upon us (**10 June - 5 July 2026**). I want to **thank** all who have stepped up to fill the booth shifts so far and who are assisting in setting up our booth. In addition, we want to thank those of you who prepped tops & pens for the Fair. The Fair is a busy time for all concerned and it is important that we put forth the best image possible for the San Diego Woodturners.

One of the most important points we want to make is that it is extremely important that each person who has volunteered to work one or more shifts at the Fair, fulfill their obligation. We do understand that from time to time health issues or other emergencies come up that prevent one from fulfilling a shift. We ask that if an emergency does come up that you let us know (Steve or Jon) as soon as possible, so that we have an opportunity to find a substitute. You would also need to get the issued Fair tickets and parking pass to us asap. We need to then notify the Fair of these changes because of security reasons and the fact that we bring in tools.

If this is your first time volunteering you might have questions about what you should bring to your shift. We have tried to keep this simple. You will need to bring your turning tools and personal protective equipment. Please do not bring all of your tools. We are turning small objects and you should bring appropriate tools for **turning tops and pens**. **Safety Item: No open toed shoes allowed while in the booth turning:**

There is a break room in The Design and Wood Building for us to use. Typically water and soda are provided. The Fair administration has asked us to keep sanding to a minimum. All finishes and child safe felt pens will be provided by our club. We have prepped tops and pen kits for you to turn. Remember to wear protective equipment at all times while you are turning.

Our main objective is the promotion of the woodturning craft. However, we do have signage asking for donations for tops and pens for our program that serves Wounded Veterans as a secondary objective. We ask you to arrive about 30 minutes early. Traffic is sometimes a problem and we want you coming relaxed and ready to meet the public.

At the end of each day, one of the volunteers will count the donations and take all but \$20.00 (leave the \$20.00 in small bills for the next day) home. This person will be asked to write and mail a check to SDWT (1220 Rosecrans St. #233, San Diego, CA 92106). We will have pre-addressed envelopes at the back of the booth for you to use. Write the date you volunteered on the check so that we can better track the donations coming in.

The parking passes and fair tickets should be arriving at your home mail boxes. Parking for exhibitors is via the **Solana Gate** (See back of passes for Map/entry point). Our booth is inside the door on the right of the Design in Wood exhibit building. Remember that as a paid member, you have access to the [SDWT Members facebook group](#) I hope you decide to join the group, it's a very simple way of interacting with other members of the club.

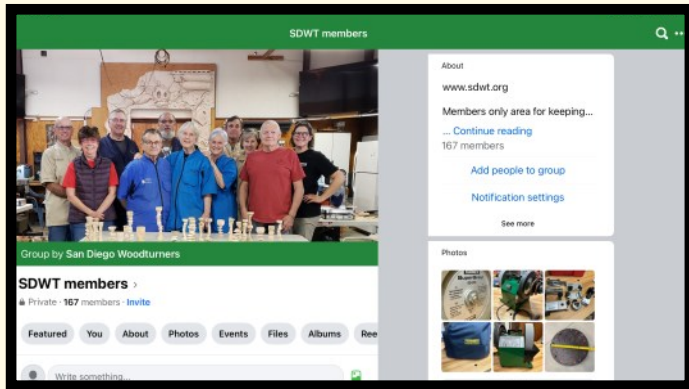
