from the Prez . . .

. A **Thank You** to Paul Russell for last month's demonstration on working with and turning burl material. An interesting demonstration on working with various odd shaped burls and the mounting onto a lathe for turning. His sample turnings displayed were quite the end result of some creative thinking and shaping. Two one - day classes followed from which all indications was well received from those that attended. So next time you see that very odd and gnarly piece of wood, give some thought to turning it into some-thing that brings out the curve, grain, and "unique" shape. Great demonstration Paul and thanks from SDWT.

Dave John Recently AAW held a virtual membership meeting presented by the Executive Staff of AAW. If you were not able to listen in, a few highlights I captured from that meeting;

1) AAW staff and Board are undergoing a strategic review looking at both operational and policy review. A consultant firm is assisting the AAW Executive Board and new Executive Director Jennifer Newberg in this review.

2) AAW budget finances for 2022—Income \$1,668,830/Expenses - \$2,000,973. (Deficit shortfall (\$332,143) supported by AAW Reserve account).

AAW budget finances for 2023 (to date) - Income \$1,861,872, Expenses—\$2,099,150 (Deficit shortfall of \$237,278 being supported from AAW Reserve account),

3) Membership: Approx 14,000 + members

Skill Level: 19% Advanced, 5% professional, 23% Beginner, 53% Intermediate

Age level: 45% - 65-74 yrs, 19% 75+, 55-64 yrs 24%, 45-54 yrs 8%, 35-44yrs 3%, members younger then 34, 1%

4) AAW Symposium 2023 in Louisville, Attendance currently at 800 +, Expecting will end with approx 1100-1200 attendee's.

5) May 23-25, 2024, AAW Symposium returns to Portland Oregon.

6) Staff spoke to Grants made in 2022 (Lathes to Schools, clubs, Art Center, and a Sr Center) (School Grants to schools for pen turning supplies)

7) Spoke to the Virtual Programming events held in last 12 months to include 15 on line events held.

8) AAW Gallery of Wood Art Exhibitions held in St Paul & onsite Wood Art collection.

9) Increased digital outreach with 516% increase in Facebook, 230% increase in Instagram

10) Highlighted the Honorary Lifetime Member award to **Mike Mahoney** for his many contributions and advancement of woodturning.

Fair Update: Steve Frick (SDWT Fair Coordinator along with Jon Chernow) are busy with our preparations for this years Fair at Del Mar. Top prep is still in the works and if you have Top material still out pls bring to our May meeting along with any tops made. Pens as well. Steve further provides a heads-up (see page 20) on What to Expect at the Fair when manning our booth.

Related: we still have a shorfall in our Booth shifts at the Fair. Pls give all do consideration to assisting the club with signing up to do your part as a member of SDWT and contribute some time. Our goal is sharing in our woodturning passion with the Public and secondarily we turn tops and pens for donation. It is a worthwhile event and as a bonus you get two tickets and a parking pass. What better way to enjoy the Fair in doing a little turning and then go enjoy the Fair with your better half.

Steve must submit our booth participant listing to San Diego Fine Woodworkers (host at Design in Wood) and Fair officials around 12 May. This administrative item is important in order for Fair administrators to get mailings out to all along with your two free Fair tickets and free parking pass prior to the Fair. Bring your notebooks for this months demonstration with **Tom Edwards** on *Woodturned Item Finishing*. It will be a whirlwind of information. The many options of finishing application of a turned piece will range from applications with oil & waxes, of Mahoney Walnut oil, wipe on poly, Tung Oil, Shellac, Poly-acrylic, Lacquer finish, resin finishes, CA (thin CA) finish, and use of EEE/Crystal Coat to name a few. In addition, what about preparing your piece i.e., sanding, prior to finish application. Tom wil

discuss this as well in his presentation. The pictures below provide some of the many turned items by Tom that provides various finish applications on wood material.

April has been another good, busy month for TAV. Our new volunteers are working in very well and helping our participants learn and improve their woodturning skills.

I hope everyone had a chance to see the club blast we put out regarding the new Torrey Pine wood. Prior to our April meeting Chad LaVoi and I was able to get five large pieces of Torrey Pine delivered to Nottingham. All five pieces were cut into smaller, manageable pieces and taken home by club members. After the meeting I was able to get four more sections to Nottingham; they will be available at the May meeting. This wood was extremely green so I expect it will be a while before pieces can be returned for donation to the Torrey Pines Gift Shop but I will be happy to collect them as they come in and make another delivery in the early July timeframe. I was also informed that there may be another tree that needs to be removed in the near future.

There was an active shooter alarm at NMC on Friday, April 14 which luckily turned out to be a false alarm. However, it did shut things down for a few hours. I have contacted Tasha Castro at NMC and Helen Liguori at Wounded Warrior Barracks to find out what their security response would be. I will put out a notice to all three TAV sites once I get specific security directions.

At the April meeting, I requested volunteers to help staff our SDWT booth at the Vista Strawberry Festival on Sunday, May 28. All slots on both shifts are filled and I really appreciate people volunteering for this event. We will have four lathes set up plus tables of turned items that people can make donations for. Last year we raised over \$1,500 in a single day and we are hoping to do even better this year. The entire downtown area of Vista will be closed to vehicle traffic with vendors and entertainers and a huge crowd of visitors.

If you are looking for something fun to do on May 28 you should consider this street fair. Just be aware that parking will be on the outskirts of town.

Mentoring Program



DelMar Fair 2023 - SDWT Booth

The Del Mar Fair for 2023 is almost upon us (**7 June** -**4 July 2023**). I want to thank all who have stepped up to fill the SDWT booth shifts and who will be assisting in setting up our booth. In addition, we want to thank those of you who prepped tops & pens for the Fair. The Fair is a busy time for all concerned and it is important that we put forth the best image possible for the San Diego Woodturners.

One of the most important points we want to make is that it is extremely important that each person who has volunteered to work one or more shifts at the Fair fulfill their obligation. We do understand that from time to time health issues or oth-

er emergencies come up that prevent one from fulfilling a shift. We ask that if an emergency does come up that you let us know as soon as possible so that we have an opportunity to find a substitute. You would also need to get Fair tickets and parking pass to us asap. We need to then notify the Fair of these changes because of security reasons and the fact that we bring in tools.

If this is your first time volunteering you might have questions about what you should bring to your shift. We have tried to keep this simple. You will need to bring your turning tools and personal protective equipment. Please do not bring all of your tools. We are turning small objects and you should bring appropriate tools for turning tops, pens, etc.

There is a break room in The Design and Wood Building for us to use. Typically water and soda are provided. The Fair administration has asked us to keep sanding to a minimum. All finishes and child safe felt pens will be provided by our club. We have prepped tops and pen kits for you to turn. If you turn other small items you will need to bring these materials. Remember to wear protective equipment at all times while you are turning.

While manning the booth we do have signage asking for donation for a top and/or pen that in part supports TAV. Please do not work on personal projects unless you plan on donating these items. We ask you to arrive about 30 minutes early. Traffic is sometimes a problem and we want you coming relaxed and ready to meet the public.

At the end of each day one of the volunteers will count the donations and take all but \$20.00 (leave the \$20.00 in small bills for the next day) home. This person will be asked to write and mail a check to SDWT (9984 Scripps Ranch #198, San Diego, CA 92131). We will have pre-addressed envelopes at the back of the booth for you to use. Write the date you volunteered on the check so that we can better track the donations coming in.

The parking passes and fair tickets should arrive at your home a couple of weeks before the Fair. Parking information will be provided as soon as we hear from SDFWA. 
