SHAVINGS

from the Prez . . .

Hi, Fellow Isolates,

As I sit down to write this May 2020 edition of Shavings, it's difficult not to see our lives upside down. Our health care system is stressed, the economy is in distress, many people are out of work, many critical items are in short supply, many people are sick and too many have died. We have been confined to our homes for only 6 weeks and yet we feel claustrophobic and cut off from the rest of the world. We miss our children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, our friends and neighbors. And perhaps, worst of all, we have incomplete information and no clear guidance on how long this will last or how things will get back to "normal" – or what the new normal will look like. These are strange, frightening and uncertain times.

Yet we are a resilient people and I am an optimist! I don't know when and I don't know how, but I believe that we will rise to this challenge and that things will be better. We have all seen acts of grace, kindness and courage during this outbreak. As we adjust to store closures, supply shortages, long lines, social distancing, face coverings, etc. we experience kind people and acts of kindness that are so typical of Americans. As I write this, the country, California and San Diego are announcing plans to "open up" and restart the economy.

I am grateful for family, friends, police, first responders, delivery drivers, post men and women and to all who risk their health and lives to support us.

Many in our club are in "high risk" groups. We are largely elderly, and many have pre-existing conditions. As restrictions ease and the economy opens up, each of us must make the decision to emerge from isolation in our and our family's best interest. Those of us in high risk groups may want to consider continuing to be locked down for a while, at least until more information is available. These times are unprecedented.

Yet, we have much to be thankful for. Even with all club activities that involve personal contact shut down, we and the AAW are working to provide interaction, content and wood turning experiences.

Our First Virtual Club Meeting:

While we couldn't "get our act together" when the lock-down first hit and had to cancel our March meeting, we were able to do a Zoom virtual demo on April 18, at 09:00 AM, our regularly scheduled date and time. I want to thank Joe Fleming for organizing and presenting an excellent demonstration on Air Brush Technique. I also want to thank Esther Assemat for co-hosting the meeting and for ensuring that attendees were active members of SDWT.

We began the meeting with a Zoom "Waiting Room: at 08:30 where members could talk and socialize with each other. At 09:00 participant's microphones were muted, and the meeting began with, as usual, administration. Joe's presentation began at about 09:30 and was excellent! Both sound and video quality were good and participants were able to ask questions.

The presentation and Q + A period went to about noon. While, as at our usual meetings, participants came into and went out of the meeting the maximum attendance was 79 device screens. We know that some screens had more than 1 participant as Pat and I watched the same screen. THANK YOU, Joe for your preparation, equipment and great presentation!

There were few technical issues. Unfortunately, the biggest glitch was that, in the newness and confusion, we forgot to record the presentation. Graciously, Joe has agreed to do the presentation again, and this time we will record it. We hope to be able to send out a link to members so that they can watch "live" as Joe does it and we are learning how to make the recording available to our members. **THANK YOU AGAIN, Joe**.

COVID-19 Cancellations:

Due to the pandemic all SDWT activities that involve personal contact are suspended until further notice. TAV at the Aspire Center is able to continue several days a week supervised by a club member who is also an employee. Supplies for Aspire are being dropped off by me or shipped directly to the site. Administration reports that wood turning is a major therapeutic activity for the patients during their lock-down.

Even though the wood program is not collecting wood, if anyone hears of a tree coming down or good wood available, please contact Dan White.

I anticipate that SDWT activities that involve personal contact will remain suspended for the remainder of the year. Even if the government relaxes restrictions and "opens up" the economy, SDWT members constitute a high-risk group and we may choose to voluntarily stay isolated for a longer period of time.

During these times of separation, it is important to our health that we engage in our hobby, stay active and stay connected.

Our Virtual Schedule:

We will continue virtual meetings and demonstrations for the foreseeable future. As much as possible these virtual meetings will be scheduled at our usual meeting time and information will be posted in the Newsletter and our Website. We are also looking for other virtual content that may be made available at other times.

Working with the demonstrators we plan to start each meeting with a virtual meeting room at 08:30. Just a Reminder to All SDWT Members





Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are sophisticated and change their tactics frequently.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID-19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion!

DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasures at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

REMEMBER, cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

From the SDWT Newsletter Archive: Sept 2005

It is Hard Work Being a Wood Artist

By Charlie B (re. crafts.woodturning) (SDWT NL Sept 2005 p.7)

I had a flash of insight into how to become a Studio Woodworker, or specifically a Turnist, Furnitureist and maybe a Boxist. Woodist is just to vague

First, you've got to come up with a "style" which is easily recognized. It can either be easily copied (gets your style out there in the public eye and makes you "orginal works" more valuable, or so complicated that no one else can figure out how to do knock offs before you come up with your next new style).

Second, you've got to work in "series" of "periods" or "phases", making variations and variations of variations of a "concept" that fits into your "style". A great story about the genesis of each "series" and a unique story about each piece, along, perhaps, with your interpretation of its meaning, is also a good idea. If your're going after The Art World, skip your interpretation of a piece's meaning - art collectors love to interpret things and share their insights with guests at cocktail parties. If that's your marker, better use obscure names for each piece.

Third, you must come up with memorable names for each "piece" In a series. The name should fit the story developed in The Second Insight.

Fourth, sign and date each piece, or at least initial it and date it.

Fifth, keep a written journal of your "work" - that will add to the "provenance" and extracts can be included in the catalogue of each of your shows.

Sixth, work in either rare, exotic woods OR really cheap/less expensive very common woods either end of the spectrum will work - if you get out on the extremes.

Seventh, always give the dimensions of each piece in millimeters - it's more continental and makes things seem bigger than they actually are. That's if you're in the USA. If you're anywhere else, use inches. Patrons love to do a little mental exercise between writing checks.

Eighth, change how you pronounce your first name - the one on your birth certificate. It'll stick in peoples' minds better. Charles for example becomes Chawls or Sharuls or Shawls.

Ninth, add some kind of accent mark to your last name to change and emphasize the syllable. Jones with a tilde over the "e" becomes jo-Nez. If you last names is only one syllable, add a letter or two. Smith sounds pretty common. Both Smiythe on the other hand, or better yet Smipth (the "p" is silent, as in swimming, (sorry—life-guard joke) will stick in peoples heads. If all else fails, add an umlaut (sp?)

Tenth, use words that don't go together "my work is nano-monumental" or has a certain dynamic repose" or "is perfectly asymmetric" or "has a static fluidity to it". (Worked for Led Zepplin - but didn't work for Iron Butterfly). IF you can't come up with anything in English, throw in some French. Avoid GERMAN - too guttural. IF a word requires phlegm to pronounce it correctly it's best to skip it - unless your market is in Germany, Austria or Belgium. Also avoid Russian - finding fonts for your "exhibit catalogue might be difficult.

Still working on attire, hair, accessories and studio ambiance.

Designed by professional woodturner **Mike Jackofsky** and manufactured in the USA by the *Hunter Tool Company*.

1) The Hollow-Pro Rocket Tool:

These tools feature a unique negative angle built into the tip. They have been specifically designed to use the Hunter carbide cutters; the negative angle makes the carbide less aggressive and easier to control. Hollow Pro Rocket tools are professional, fast and efficient hollowing tools for making hollow vessels up to about 7" high x about 7" diameter. These 8" tools have 3/8" shafts to allow hollowing through very small restricted openings. The tools use replaceable #1 size carbide cutters and are designed to fit into any large handle with a 3/8" or ½" opening. (Tip: place the screws from these handles on the side or top of the tools, so the bottom will slide smoothly on the tool rest).

The round shafts of these tools can be rotated slightly to make clean "shear" cuts and the bent tool is also very useful for undercutting the opening on larger hollow vessels. The kit comes with one straight and one bent tool and includes replaceable Hunter #1 carbide cutters for clean cuts and durability, and a Torx wrench for rotating and replacing the cutters as needed.







2) The Hollow Pro Calipers provide accurate measurements in crucial areas of hollow vessels and open bowls.

Hollow-Pro Calipers are precision made from steel and aluminum for maximum strength while maintain a comfortable light weight. The small size will work for hollow forms up to about 8" in diameter and up to $6\frac{1}{4}$ " deep. The larger size works for hollow forms up to about 18" in diameter and up to $11\frac{3}{4}$ " deep.



Mentoring Program




