

from the Prez . . .

_It's survey time! Staying Connected While We Must Stay Apart August 2020

These are strange and difficult times. The pandemic has stopped us from meeting and presented us with challenges that we never imagined we would have to face. As I write this the virus is surging and it looks like we will be unable to meet in person anytime soon. During this time of forced distancing our Board of Directors and program chair have worked hard to provide virtual digital meetings and

demonstrations. We have only missed the March meeting as it took a little time to get our "stuff together"! While we understand that virtual meetings do not adequately replace face-to-face meetings, they appear to be the "best we have" for now. We have tried to have social time by opening meetings 30 minutes early and allowing open mics to encourage socialization.

This is uncharted new territory for us, and we are learning on the fly. It is discouraging for us when we realize that club members are not participating in many of our activities and our Board would like to understand why. We currently have about 230 members. Between 65% and 85% of our members open "blasts" from info@sdwt.org. These blasts contain important information and we hope that all will read them. A little less than one half of the membership participate on the SDWT Members Only Facebook page and fewer than half of these post anything. Well less than one half of our membership have participated in our free ZOOM Meetings and demonstrations.

We need your help! This is our club. Your board is composed of elected volunteers. The board feels that it is very important to stay engaged, involved and connected during this terrible and prolonged pandemic. We need to understand why you are or are not using available resources. We will endeavor to present programs and educational materials that meet your needs and desires.

To help us understand how to put together useful programs, increase participation and meet your needs we have put together this survey. The questions revolve around computers, the internet and our comfort with virtual technology. We also need to learn what topics, which demonstrators and how you would like the material presented.

The survey will be sent out soon online, so look for it in your email from info@sdwt.org. Please fill out the survey as completely as you can. Individual responses will be confidential. We will share summary data and trends with our membership. Thank You ahead of time for your participation in this survey.

Are you having technical issues with connecting to the internet or Zoom?

Please contact one of us if you are experiencing technical problems connecting with our club and we will try to help.

Virtual Meetings and Demonstrations Continuing.

The pandemic continues and so we must remain physically apart. Virtual club meetings and demonstrations on Zoom are scheduled through the end of this year. I think that our virtual club meetings and demos on Zoom have been going very well. I really enjoyed Cindy Drozda's demo on Banksia pods. She has a great camera set-up for Zoom and is an excellent presenter. For our August meeting band saw expert Alex Snodgrass will show us how to tune up and properly maintain our bandsaws and, if time allows, will show us how to make a bandsaw box.

The open forum waiting room will open at 08:30, our business meeting will begin at 09:00 and the demonstration will begin at 09:30. I hope to see you all at our virtual meeting on August 15.

I want to thank Sally Ault for her hard work in lining up terrific virtual demonstrators for us to enjoy.

First (and Hopefully Last) AAW Virtual Symposium.

The first virtual AAW Symposium was held on Zoom from July 10 - 12. The cost to attend virtually was \$20.20 and was a great value. Almost 4000 participants signed up. I was fortunate to be able to watch all 3 days. There were some technical problems, but overall the symposium went very well. It is hoped that this will be the last virtual symposium and that, in 2021, we will be able to meet in person. The AAW symposium next year is scheduled to be in Omaha, Nebraska July 15 - 18, 2021. Hoping for an effective vaccine to be widely available in time!

Just a Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are sophisticated and change their tactics frequently.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID-19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion!

DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasures at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

REMEMBER, cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

Another Option on Bandsaw Blade Ordering

Bandsaw Blade group order information for **Carter Blades**

I have been a fan of Carter blades for some time. Every bandsaw blade is sharp when you get it but I have found that the Carter blades retain their sharpness longer than other brands I have used. ..especially my favorite greenwood blades.

My source at Carter tells me:

Carter blades are produced using a premium Carbon Steel with precision milled teeth. (not stamped) The blades are flex back, induction hardened for long life. We tooth match every blade at welding and we guarantee the weld for life. If the blade ever breaks at the weld just send it back and we will replace it. Lastly, our Greenwood blades are thicker than our standard blades, making them ideal for resawing and for longer life. Greenwood blades are .032 thickness vs. standard blades, which are .025.

I know more of the technical stuff about these blades that I will tell you if you need to know.

If you want to order blades or have questions, please contact me at sallyault@cox.net or call if you need more information (phone number in members only section of the SDWT website.

To order I will need to know blade length, blade width, # of teeth and quantity of blades. You will send me a check (made out to me not SDWT). I am also set up for Venmo. When the blades arrive I will figure out how to get them distributed.

Here are the prices for the most common length and width of blades. Carter will also custom make any length you want...I will just need to check the price.

93 $\frac{1}{2}$ "---all regular blades between $\frac{1}{8}$ "x 14tpi and $\frac{1}{2}$ x 3,4 or 6 tpi are \$19.60 93 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Greenwood blades are \$23.60 for $\frac{3}{8}$ "x 3tpi and \$24.40 for $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 3tpi. 105" ..all regular blades between $\frac{3}{8}$ x 4 or 10 tpi and $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3,4 or 6tpi are \$20.79 105" Greenwood blades $\frac{3}{8}$: x 3tpi are 24.79, $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 3 TPI is \$25.20 111"...all regular blades between $\frac{1}{8}$ " x 14tpi and $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3,4 or 6 TPI are \$21.59. 111 Greenwood blades are \$25.20 for $\frac{3}{8}$ x 3 tpi and \$25.59 for $\frac{5}{8}$ " x 3 TPI.

I will have to add a small amount for shipping...I will try to get that figured out.

Hollow-Pro Tools

Designed by professional woodturner **Mike Jackofsky** and manufactured in the USA by the *Hunter Tool Company*.

1) The Hollow-Pro Rocket Tool:

These tools feature a unique negative angle built into the tip. They have been specifically designed to use the Hunter carbide cutters; the negative angle makes the carbide less aggressive and easier to control. Hollow Pro Rocket tools are professional, fast and efficient hollowing tools for making hollow vessels up to about 7" high x about 7" diameter. These 8" tools have 3/8" shafts to allow hollowing through very small restricted openings. The tools use replaceable #1 size carbide cutters and are designed to fit into any large handle with a 3/8" or ½" opening. (Tip: place the screws from these handles on the side or top of the tools, so the bottom will slide smoothly on the tool rest).

The round shafts of these tools can be rotated slightly to make clean "shear" cuts and the bent tool is also very useful for undercutting the opening on larger hollow vessels. The kit comes with one straight and one bent tool and includes replaceable Hunter #1 carbide cutters for clean cuts and durability, and a Torx wrench for rotating and replacing the cutters as needed.







2) The Hollow Pro Calipers provide accurate measurements in crucial areas of hollow vessels and open bowls.

Hollow-Pro Calipers are precision made from steel and aluminum for maximum strength while maintain a comfortable light weight. The small size will work for hollow forms up to about 8" in diameter and up to 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " deep. The larger size works for hollow forms up to about 18" in diameter and up to 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ " deep.

Our mentoring program is one of the unique benefits of our club. Our mentors can help with basic to complex turning and teach safety along the way. This is a great way to start out or hone your skills with complex tasks taught by turners skilled in specific areas of turning. Our mentors are volunteers and are dedicated to sharing information on all facets of woodturning.

Rest assured however, that all of our mentors are easy to work with. Most often the mentor opens his/her shop to the applicant at a mutually agreed upon time and schedule.


