Roman mastered several new skills that had nothing to do with wood turning in order to bring us his superb presentation. He recorded his own videos and Power Point Presentation. Joe Fleming assisted Roman in putting it all together and on assuring that all parts ran smoothly. What a successful effort! Thank you, I have already started to try to make some of the tools that Roman demonstrated and I hope to see several captive ring pieces at our Show and Tell on April 17 as well as some of the spade bit turned into turning tools!

I think that most of us know that Roy Ulrich is our Webmaster and de-

veloped our new sdwt.org website. Our new website just marked its one year anniversary. Many may not know that Roy serves as a co-host at our Zoom meetings and is responsible for recording our social time/ Show and Tell, business meeting and, when the demonstrator gives permission, the demonstrations. After the meeting, Roy downloads the recordings, converts them to a format compatible with YouTube, develops time stamps that make searching the recordings more convent and uploads the recordings to the Members Only section of our website for our viewing pleasure. I have really enjoyed viewing these recordings and have looked at Roman's presentation as I attempt to make the tools that he demonstrated. Thank you, Roy.

I want to thank everyone who volunteers (About 20% of total membership). Your efforts make our club the wonderful organization that it is! Thank you!

COVID-19:

Things are looking up in San Diego! Infection rates, hospitalizations and deaths are decreasing. San Diego has moved into the less restrictive Red Tier and things are slowly opening up. While there are still significant problems with vaccine availability, vaccination rates are steadily increasing and vaccines are available to more groups of people.

SDWT has scheduled an in-person Wood Day, etc. at Nottingham Center, 240 S. Bent Avenue, San Marcos, Ca 92078 from 09:00 to 12:00 noon. In addition to wood, Ca glue, sanding disks, Abranet, the video library, Lu Majaris with logo wear, logo mugs and water bottles and membership will be available. A group of volunteers will be inspecting and maintaining club lathes and equipment and the A/V Committee will be meeting.

COVID is still a threat and masks and social distancing are required!

We are working on a re-opening plan. All scheduled meetings through October 2021, are virtual Zoom meetings with remote demonstrators. Sally and Karen plan to do an in-person demonstration at Nottingham in November and we are (fingers crossed) planning an in-person Holiday Party on the second Saturday in December. Presuming that there is a stable high speed internet connection at Nottingham, we are developing the capability to Zoom our meetings and demonstrations live (with demonstrator permission) from Nottingham and to be able to record the meetings and demonstrator for posting to the Members Only Section of our website.

We may be able to open one TAV site as early as May. The Veterans Administration Aspire Center in Old Town San Diego is an inpatient ling care facility. We have been able to keep the Aspire woodturning program open on a limited basis supervised by club member and Aspire Center employee, Ben Bramer. All patients and staff are vaccinated against COVID-19 and it appears that most of our Aspire TAV volunteers are vaccinated as well. Paul is working with the director of the Aspire to obtain the necessary permissions to safely resume the TAV program at the Aspire Center with vaccinated patients, staff and, of course, only fully vaccinated TAV volunteers. Unfortunately, it looks like it will be quite a bit longer before we are able to open the other TAV sites.

<u>AAW:</u>

The AAW has cancelled the 2021 AAW Symposium that was scheduled in Omaha, Nebraska on July 15 – 18, because of uncertainties about COVID-19. A virtual symposium will be held on July 17 and 18. Please monitor the AAW website (woodturner.org) for details. The AAW Symposium in 2020 was also virtual. Despite the short time available to plan the virtual event, the AAW was able to put on an excellent program. I expect this year's virtual symposium to be as excellent and I urge you all to attend. Please check the AAW website woodturner.org for registration details.

SCAMS:

The newsletter is published on April 1, April Fools Day! Don't let April be the month of scams! The criminals are almost everywhere and they can be very sophisticated! Stay vigilant! Keep a high level of suspicion at all times! If in doubt, don't! Remember the club will never e-mail you and ask for money, gift cards or cryptocurrency. Stay alert, stay suspicious and stay safe.

<u>Membership:</u>

Yes, I know that it is April and a little late in the year to talk about membership renewal. At our last club meeting on March 20, we learned that our membership is 185. Renewals are still trickling in and I urge you to renew your membership now. Last year, 2020, our membership was 232. We expected a decrease in membership renewal as several folks told us that they wouldn't participate in our virtual meetings. We regret their decision not to renew as our club has been able to provide rich content and have made beneficial affiliations with the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association and the Channel Island Woodturners. I remind you that we are planning to resume safe inperson meetings at Nottingham in the 4th quarter of this year. Also you must be a member in good standing to receive the password to the Members Only Section of our website, to use mentors, to use the video library, to attend wood days and to volunteer for TAV. Our club offers great value and we hope that you will renew.

Safety:

My bad! I forgot to mention in the March issue of Shavings that March 14, marks the beginning of Daylight Savings Time. I know that you all moved your clocks forward 1 hour, but did you remember to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors? Did you remember to check your fire extinguishers? Do you have enough fire extinguishers? Have you placed your fire extinguishers where you need them? Do you know where your fire extinguishers are? Please, check your fire extinguishers at least every 6 months or more often. Assure that your fire extinguishers are full, have the appropriate pressure and are in date. Test smoke detectors and CO monitors according to the manufacturer's recommendations. Replace fire extinguishers , smoke detectors and CO monitors that are out of date. Spring forward and fall back are good times to remember to do these important safety checks. I hope to see you on April 10, at our wood event and virtually at our meeting on April 17, where Linda Ferber will be our demonstrator.

Empty Bowls Returns for 2021 May 8th Event

Empty Bowls is an annual fundraising event that happens all over the country. Artisans and Crafts people provide ceramic and/or wooden bowls and feed the hungry in respective3 communities. In San Diego the proceeds, thru sales of ceramic and wooden bowls, go to TACO (third Avenue Charitable Organization).

For years it was the Potters in San Diego who did the event and a few years ago they asked if SDWT would like to be apart of it with turning some wooden bowls.

In a normal year at the event there are many tables of bowls set out. People pay \$20 and pick any bowl they want. They then can go and have soup and breads provided by some of the best restaurants around.

If a ceramic bowl is chosen they have washing stations so you can use your bowl. They also provide paper bowls for those who choose wood or don't want to use their bowl.

The event is May 8th this year and will be modified because of the pandemic.

Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are so-phisticated and change their tactics frequently.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID -19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion! **DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE**!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasure at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

REMEMBER, cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

Turn Around for Veterans (TAV)

Chairman: Paul Simpson .



Turn Around for Vets (TAV) is a critical program of the San Diego Woodturners Club. All TAV activities are carried out by a dedicated, unpaid group of volunteers so that 100% of donated funds, designated for TAV, are used to purchase supplies and equipment and to support the program. As always, any one can make a cash or material donation to SDWT, designated for TAV, and receive a letter from our treasurer that acknowledges the gift as a tax deducti ble item, if otherwise eligible under current tax code.



Paul (TAV Committee Chairman)

TAV activity during the month of March has been focused on planning for re-opening each site. Paul Simpson received a call from Dr. Carl Rimmele, the director of the Aspire Care Center to discuss the possibility of allowing volunteer TAV instructors to begin teaching again. Aspire is unique compared to the other two sites because the program is a 6 to 8 month live-in experience, the residents and staff are all required to have COVID 19 vaccinations, their temperatures are checked every time they return and masks are required while inside the facility. Dr. Rimmele needs to work with the VA to allow volunteers back into the facility but he has already started the process on a case-by-case basis; TAV is not the only volunteer organization supporting Aspire. Dr. Rimmele has already approved the re-opening plan Paul presented last month. All TAV volunteers who are willing to work at Aspire will need to have completed their COVID 19 vaccinations and have up-to-date VA volunteer training and background checks completed. Paul is in the process of asking previous Aspire volunteers if they are willing to resume teaching. This request has been reviewed with the SDWT Board of Directors during the March 27 Board of Directors meeting and approved by unanimous consent. It is expected that re-opening will be in the May timeframe after VA approval and a check of all equipment and supplies.

Dan Zeller, the Armed Forces YMCA volunteer coordinator at NMC has begun a process to update volunteer badging, background checks and Occupational Safety and Health screening. He has also notified Paul that some volunteers will be allowed to resume work starting 1 May. However, TAV will not resume instruction for the time being because the potential participants are not as stringently controlled and monitored as the Aspire residents. It is not expected that TAV will resume at NMC until conditions necessary to resume SDWT face-to-face are met.

There have also been initial exchanges of information with out TAV hosts at the Wounded Warrior Barracks, Camp Pendleton but resuming teaching there will be delayed similar to NMC, San Diego

Paul will be at the April 10th Wood day at Nottingham. If you have pens, bowls, tops ot other items for TAV pls bring them. He will also have a supply of pen kits and tubes if you need them to make TAV donations. We are also willing to accept any Torrey Pine bowls that you may have been saving. Other bowls I recommend donating to Empty Bowls.

Thank You for your continued support for TAV and discuss the program with your friends.

Hollow-Pro Tools

Designed by professional woodturner **Mike Jackofsky** and manufactured in the USA by the *Hunter Tool Company.*


1) The Hollow-Pro Rocket Tool:

These tools feature a unique negative angle built into the tip. They have been specifically designed to use the Hunter carbide cutters; the negative angle makes the carbide less aggressive and easier to control. Hollow Pro Rocket tools are professional, fast and efficient hollowing tools for making hollow vessels up to about 7" high x about 7" diameter. These 8" tools have 3/8" shafts to allow hollowing through very small restricted openings. The tools use replaceable #1 size carbide cutters and are designed to fit into any large handle with a 3/8" or $\frac{1}{2}$ " opening. (Tip: place the screws from these handles on the side or top of the tools, so the

bottom will slide smoothly on the tool rest).

The round shafts of these tools can be rotated slightly to make clean "shear" cuts and the bent tool is also very useful for undercutting the opening on larger hollow vessels. The kit comes with one straight and one bent tool and includes replaceable Hunter #1 carbide cutters for clean cuts and durability, and a Torx wrench for rotating and replacing the cutters as needed.





2) **The Hollow Pro Calipers** provide accurate measurements in crucial areas of hollow vessels and open bowls.

Hollow-Pro Calipers are precision made from steel and aluminum for maximum strength while maintain a comfortable light weight. The small size will work for hollow forms up to about 8" in diameter and up to 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " deep. The larger size works for hollow forms up to about 18" in diameter and up to 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ " deep.

Mentoring Program




