Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are so-phisticated and change their tactics frequently and continue with their attacks.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID -19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion! **DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE**!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasurer at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.


PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

TAV is open at the Aspire Center and Naval Medical Center (NMC). The first weeks at NMC have been slow but our efforts to get the word out through postings in the Center Plan of the Day and setting up an information table in the main courtyard (next to starbucks in order to take advantage of their customer traffic) are starting to draw participants. We have distributed over 100 flyers and many people are interested but they need to be able to attend when thier schedules allow. The residents and staff at Aspire are keeping the lathes running and the last week in Sept three new residents started taking lessons Feedback from participants at both locations is very appreciative of our efforts.

During the Sept SDWT meeting we stressed the need for more volunteers and donations of items for TAV to offer at gift shops and demonstrations. **Vicki Price** responded with 13 very nice bowls (page 8) and **Dennis Ferguson** provided eight Torrey Pine pieces. I hope everyone will consider this as a challenge to consider donating a few items for TAV. I will be happy to collect donations at the October 23rd Hybrid meeting at Nottingham.

Three Aspire graduates have asked about becoming TAV volunteers. We continue to need volunteers to keep TAV running. Even one day a month would help spread our work load out. The personal satisfaction from assisting veterans to lean about our woodturning craft will brighten your day and theirs too.

On Friday, October 1st, I received a phone call from the Torrey Pines Gift Shop. In the last 4 weeks they have sold most of their inventory of turnings and would like to know when we can supply them with more. I explained that we are very short at the moment but I will provide what we have after the 23rd October club meeting. They will also need a re-supply for the holidays. An Update from Esther: "Journey in France "with a few Turnings

As some of you know, I moved to France last year in the middle of the pandemic. The move had been intended as temporary, but quickly became permanent. All my woodturning shop had stayed behind, so come Christmas time, my gift was to get a lathe and some tools over here, that seemed simple enough. But due to some setbacks, the lathe has been patiently waiting for me to find a place to set up shop.

In the meantime, I participated in the WIT (Women In Turning) Exchange as a non-turner and met a other women turners here in Europe. Lillian Wagt was very interested in getting a group of us together in the Netherlands at Ronald Kanne's (her woodturning teacher) workshop. I jumped at the opportunity to attend and I'm so glad I did, for starters it had been close to a year that I had not woodturned, so I had some doubts about whether I would be able to pick right up where I left off or if I would be essentially starting over.

I'm happy to report that all I've learned thanks to SDWT has stuck for good and I was indeed able to turn as if I hadn't stopped at all. My first week in the Netherlands was spent in tourist mode around the area of Hoevelaken/Amersfoort, as well as a couple of days I spent turning at Lillian's house, where she received us very warmly and had a great time. The second week we traveled to Wehl, where Ronald has his workshop. He is a generous host and teacher, a total of five women attended, our woodturning skills were all at different levels, with different interests and Ronald helped everyone with whatever was needed, there was just one first pre-determined project on the first day, and from then on, we were free to decide what we wanted to work on, we just had to let him know what we wanted to make and he'd take us to select wood according to each person's needs. We started every day at around 8:30 until noon, when we had lunch and then back on the lathes until 6pm when we'd go back to the campground for dinner. We made bowls, platters, peppermills, hollow forms, as well as connections that everyone had been missing since the start of Covid. We're keeping in touch and Lillian wants to organize another event next year, hopefully it'll go ahead and some of you will take the time to come over!

Hollow-Pro Tools

Designed by professional woodturner **Mike Jackofsky** and manufactured in the USA by the *Hunter Tool Company.*


1) The Hollow-Pro Rocket Tool:

These tools feature a unique negative angle built into the tip. They have been specifically designed to use the Hunter carbide cutters; the negative angle makes the carbide less aggressive and easier to control. Hollow Pro Rocket tools are professional, fast and efficient hollowing tools for making hollow vessels up to about 7" high x about 7" diameter. These 8" tools have 3/8" shafts to allow hollowing through very small restricted openings. The tools use replaceable #1 size carbide cutters and are designed to fit into any large handle with a 3/8" or $\frac{1}{2}$ " opening. (Tip: place the screws from these handles on the side or top of the tools, so the

bottom will slide smoothly on the tool rest).

The round shafts of these tools can be rotated slightly to make clean "shear" cuts and the bent tool is also very useful for undercutting the opening on larger hollow vessels. The kit comes with one straight and one bent tool and includes replaceable Hunter #1 carbide cutters for clean cuts and durability, and a Torx wrench for rotating and replacing the cutters as needed.





2) **The Hollow Pro Calipers** provide accurate measurements in crucial areas of hollow vessels and open bowls.

Hollow-Pro Calipers are precision made from steel and aluminum for maximum strength while maintaining a comfortable light weight. The small size will work for hollow forms up to about 8" in diameter and up to $6 \frac{1}{4}$ " deep. The larger size works for hollow forms up to about 18" in diameter and up to $11 \frac{3}{4}$ " deep.

Mentoring Program



Rest assured however, that all of our mentors are easy to work with. Most often the mentor opens his/her shop to the applicant at a mutually agreed upon time and schedule.
