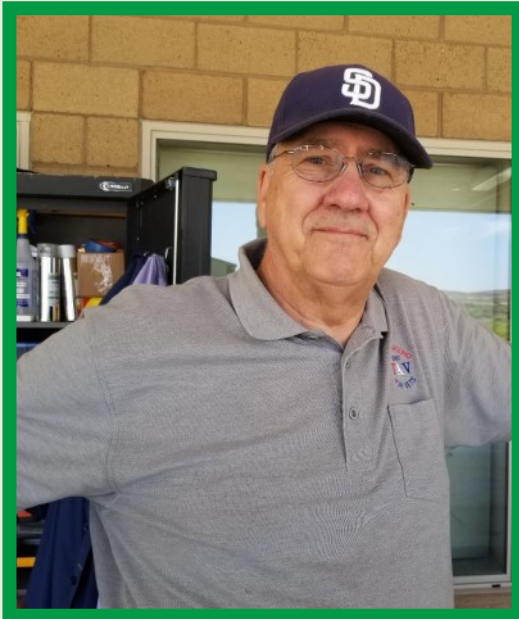

- The Fair will go from 8 June to 4 July, 2022.
- The Fair will be closed on Mondays and Tuesdays.
- The Fair has been shortened from 27 to 21 days. Hrs from 11 AM - 10 PM Sun, Weds Thurs and 11 AM to 11 PM for Friday and Saturday.
- Booth Set-up will be May 7th and take down on July 7th.

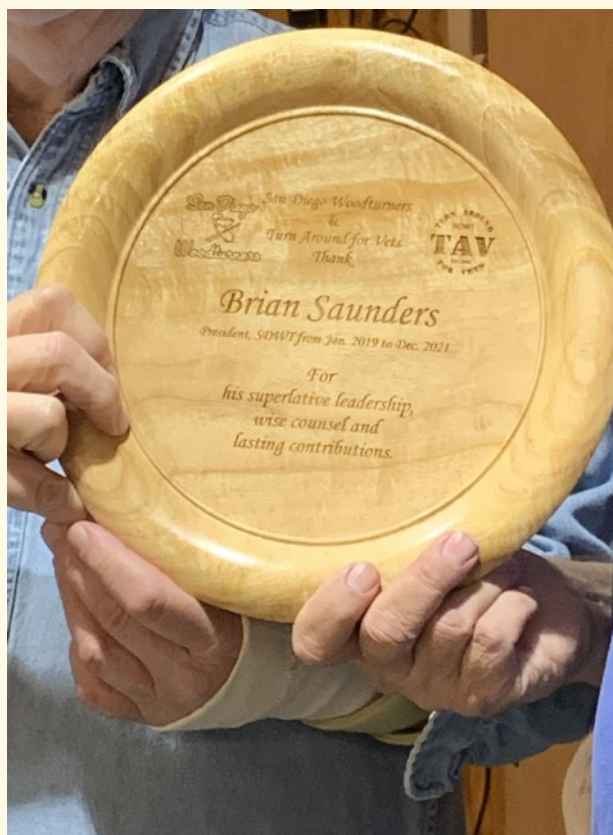

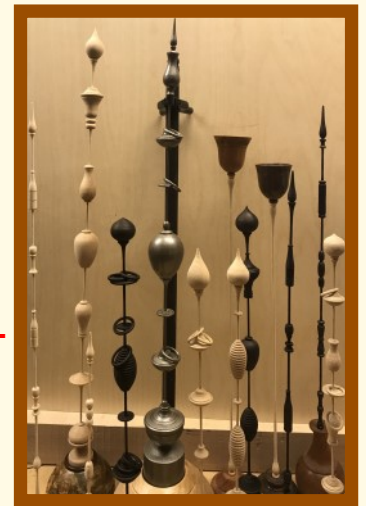

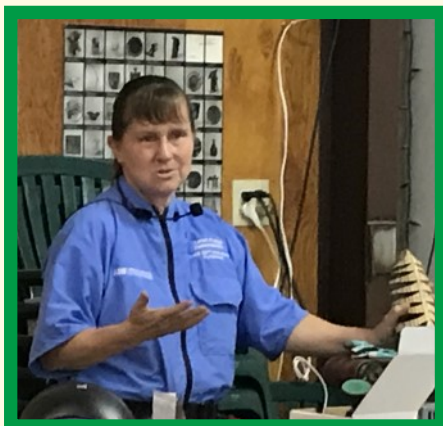


April 23rd, 2022: Our April demonstrator is Dave John who will be demonstrating on turning a “Wine Trembleur”. A spindle turning exercise that has thin stems of 2-2.5mm and turned object item’s with the use of string steadies.

Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are sophisticated and change their tactics frequently and continue with their attacks.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID-19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion!

DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasurer at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

REMEMBER, cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

Turn Around for Vets (TAV) is a critical program of the San Diego Woodturners Club. All TAV activities are carried out by a dedicated, unpaid group of volunteers so that 100% of donated funds, designated for TAV, are used to purchase supplies and equipment and to support the program.

March has been a very active month at all three sites. We have had all lathes running most of the time. We are encouraging new turners to branch out from making pens and try their hands at turning tops, mallets, other spindle work and bowls. Two of our new turners (Pic R) at Wounded Warrior Barracks have already progressed to turning their first bowls and have expressed interest in joining SDWT.

Due to the high turnout and enthusiasm since we opened at the Wounded Warrior Barracks, we have decided to expand to instruction on Tuesdays and Thursdays.



After research and an evaluation of various midi lathes, an evaluation committee consisting of Dan Lyle, Jon Chernow, Howard Katz, Brian Saunders and Paul Simpson recommends a phased replacement of the current Delta 46-460 lathes at all three sites with new Laguna Revo 1216 lathes. The Lagunas have newer features, are very sturdy and can be mounted on the Delta stands. All of the major accessories (drive centers, live centers, mandrel sets and chucks) are interchangeable between the Deltas and Lagunas. This saves considerable money as we make the transition. After discussion with the Board of Directors one Laguna has been purchased for further evaluation

. Jon Chernow and Paul Simpson mounted it to a Delta stand using a plywood mounting board. Jon has completed a 2-week session with the lathe and is very impressed with its performance and suitability for TAV use. Paul is now using the lathe and it will be used at the TAV booth at the Torrey Pines Gift Shop on Saturday April 23.



Our preparations for demonstrating woodturning at the Torrey Pines Gift Shop on Saturday April 23 are in work. This coincides with SDWT's meeting so the booth will be manned by Sally Ault, Jon Chernow and Paul Simpson. We have an excellent location on the

front side of the Gift Shop and will set up our booth under a tall Torrey Pine. The booth will be open from 9am to 2 pm if anyone would like to swing by after the club meeting.



TAV will have a booth at the Vista Strawberry Festival on May 29. This will be a one-day event. Booth setup will be early, probably starting at 7am. The booth will be open starting about 9:30 and running through 4:30pm. Then we will need to pack up. Please consider volunteering for this event also. Depending on the number of volunteers, we may be able to split this into a morning and afternoon shift. More info to follow.

Turned items including pens, small spindle work, bowls, plates, platters are needed for both events. We have some inventory left over from the December demonstrations at Botanic Gardens but more is needed. We will be turning tops and pens at both events.

Appearance and quality of finish – appropriate for type of wood, intended use, etc.

Design integrity – proportions, intended use, etc.

Use of form and color – eye appeal, etc.

Trivial Pursuit - "Chucks"

At our last meeting someone inquired as to why are chucks called "chucks" and not Charles or Sally or something else. Well it got me thinking as to the origination of wood turning chucks. Here is what I found in my trivial pursuit about woodturning chucks. Didn't find any information as to name per se but something close as to the origination of the word "Chuck". Read on - from source: "Wikipedia"- **Chuck History (engineering)**

"The original forms of work holding on lathes were between-centers holding and ad hoc fastenings to the headstock spindle. The spike-style centers still used on wood lathes represent an ancient method. Ad hoc fastening methods in centuries past included anything from pinning with clenching or wedging; nailing; lashing with cords of leather or fiber; dogging down (again involving pinning/wedging/clenching); or other types. Faceplates have probably been around at least since the era of medieval clock-makers."

"Tooling similar to today's chucks seems likely to have evolved from faceplate work, as workers using faceplates for repetitive work began to envision types of clamps or dogs for the faceplate that could be opened and closed in more convenient ways than repeated total disassembly and reassembly. A *chock* was originally just a lump of wood. However, by 1703 it could be "...Chocks belonging to the Screw-Mandrel". By 1807 the word had changed to the more familiar 'chuck: "on the end of the spindle...is screwed...a universal chuck for holding any kind of work"

"In late 1818 or early 1819 the Society for the Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce awarded its silver medal and 10 guineas to **Mr. Alexander Bell** for a three jaw lathe chuck:

"The instrument can be screwed into...the mandrel of a lathe, and has three studs projecting from its flat surface, forming an equi-lateral triangle, and are capable of being moved equably to, or from, its centre."

"It is not clear how they were moved :equably" whether by a scroll or some other means. Later in 1819 the same body awarded a further silver medal to **Mr. T. Hack** for a four jaw chuck. In the US **Simon Fairman** (1792-1857) developed a recognizable modern scroll chuck as used on lathes. The patent refers to the technicalities of assembly he does not claim invention of the scroll ("convolute groves"). His son-in-law Austin F. Cushman (1830-1914) developed the ideas and sold chucks through his business, Cushman Industries."

Continuing:: "At the start of the 20th century, **Arthur Irving Jacobs** developed the modern drill chuck. After bruising his knuckles on one of the old-fashioned spanner adjusted drill chucks, he developed a chuck in which the jaws moved axially in inclined slots. His patent of 1902 details the mechanism. The term drill chuck clearly did not originate with him, but his new type of drill chuck long ago displaced any earlier types that lacked the angled jaw movement and outer sleeve now found on all common drill chucks."
