

SDWT Demonstration/Event Schedule for 2022




I hope you are all staying well. We are blessed to have such a wonderful pastime to keep us busy.


<u>Drop-In-Saturdays</u>: Drop-in-Saturdays has resumed but help is needed. Contact Dave John

Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are sophisticated and change their tactics frequently and continue with their attacks.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID-19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion!

DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our quard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.


Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasurer at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

REMEMBER, cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

We continue to be busy at all three sites. The big news, in case you didn't hear it at the April meeting, is that we received a large grant from San Diego Armed Services YMCA that will cover the purchase of new Laguna lathes for NMC. I will be picking up the first 3 lathes on May 5 from Rockler. They should be installed and running at NMC by mid-May. Additional lathes are on order. After we get them there we will need a working party to prepare and install plywood bases so the lathes can be attached to our Delta lathe stands. More info to follow once I know when we actually have the new lathes in-hand.

We also had a very successful demonstration and fund raising event at the Torrey Pines State Reserve. Sally Ault, Jon Chernow and I set up the booth. The park had about 1,000 visitors that day for Earth Day. Our booth generated enough donations to purchase another Laguna lathe. The gift shop is completely out of turned Torrey Pine wood items. If you have some to donate, please bring them to the May club meeting.

Our next demonstration will be **May 29 at the Vista Strawberry Festival**. I will put out a separate request/blast requesting volunteers from the entire club for that event. We need donations of turned items for the booth; please bring to the May club meeting.

TAV is supplying finished pens, pen kits and pen blanks for our SDWT booth at the Fair/Design in Wood/display.

"Fair Heads-Up Info"

The Del Mar Fair for 2022 is almost upon us **(8 June - 4 July 2022)**. I want to thank all who have stepped up to fill the booth shifts so far and who are assisting in setting up our booth. In addition, we want to thank those of you who prepped tops & pens for the Fair. The Fair is a busy time for all concerned and it is important that we put forth the best image possible for the San Diego Woodturners.

One of the most important points we want to make is that it is extremely important that each person who has volunteered to work one or more shifts at the Fair, fulfill their obligation. We do understand that from time to time health issues or other emergencies come up that prevent one from fulfilling a shift. We ask that if an emergency does come up that you let us know (Steve or Jon) as soon as possible so that we have an opportunity to find a substitute. You would also need to get the issued Fair tickets and parking pass to us asap. We need to then notify the Fair of these changes because of security reasons and the fact that we bring in tools.

If this is your first time volunteering you might have questions about what you should bring to your shift. We have tried to keep this simple. You will need to bring your turning tools and personal protective equipment. Please do not bring all of your tools. We are turning small objects and you should bring appropriate tools for turning tops, pens, etc. I will also have additional info at our May meeting.

There is a break room in The Design and Wood Building for us to use. Typically water and soda are provided. The Fair administration has asked us to keep sanding to a minimum. All finishes and child safe felt pens will be provided by our club. We have prepped tops and pen kits for you to turn. Remember to wear protective equipment at all times while you are turning.

Our main objective is the promotion of the woodturning craft. However, we do have signage asking for donations for Tops and Pens for our programs that serve Wounded Veterans and serves as a secondary objective. We ask you to arrive about 30 minutes early. Traffic is sometimes a problem and we want you coming relaxed and ready to meet the public.

At the end of each day one of the volunteers will count the donations and take all but \$20.00 (leave the \$20.00 in small bills for the next day) home. This person will be asked to write and mail a check to SDWT (9984 Scripps Ranch #198, San Diego, CA 92131). We will have pre-addressed envelopes at the back of the booth for you to use. Write the date you volunteered on the check so that we can better track the donations coming in.

The parking passes and fair tickets should arrive at your home a couple of weeks before the Fair. Parking for exhibitors is still in limbo. Separate email blast and/or announcement at our meeting forthcoming as soon as I find out. Our booth is inside the door on the right of the Design in Wood exhibit building. "Magic Bullet or Just Hype"

An **Instagram** entry recently caught my eye posted by "**Woodturners-World Wide**" that I thought would be of interest to all in SDWT. Some members may have seen it who subscribe, others may have not. The article pertains to the 40/40 Grind on gouges (Stuart Batty Grind). "Is it a Magic Bullet or Just Hype?". Over 102 responses were provided with opinions varied.

What bevel grind do you use on your gouge? Opinion extracts of the responses and link follows:

Maui Woodturner: No magic bullet, who ever said that? Just one more weapon in your arsenal. Those that don't understand it never took a class with Sturart. And 99% that tried it and do not like did not grind the 40/40 right

O.S. wooddesign: I think it's more about familiarization with your tool and keeping it sharp. You could swap my gouge today for something else but in a few weeks I would be just as confident with it.

Richard Finley: Good grind but one-trick pony. My grind is more like a 50/50 and is more versatile.

Richard west woodturner: As long as the tool is sharp and suits the job and feels comfortable.

Delbasidtimbers: commonly known as the Batty vs Clews debate. At the end of the day not one single grind can do everything perfectly and it is certainly about comfortably hand can be. Great for cuts, tool presentation, and ability to replicate grinds.

Designsbyredraven: Haven't used the 40/40 grind yet, however like most it's all about what's comfortable to you. My main tool is a 1/2 inch bowl gouge with Ellsworth grind.

Phillsikes: I like how fast sharpening the 40/40 by hand can be. Great for the cuts it's designed for, but you'll need a bottom bowl gouge to go with it. It's a good grind, but there isn't one grind to rule them all.

Johnjordonwoodturning: It's just a gouge grind. Suits some folks, not others

Imadiley: My opinion, choose a grind, any grind that you can consistently sharpen and use it. Make it work for you. None of it is magic. Just time with the wood, the lathe and the tool

Trepturnings: Pure Hype

Stitchinturn.james.I get asked a lot what the perfect grind for a bowl gouge is? My answer is, who's school of thought are you going to follow; Batty, Ellsworth, Mahoney, Lucas are all fantastic turners who each have their own grind and technique. So if you want to learn one then stick with that one. Each is a good way to make a bowl and has it adv/disadv.

Og-randall: It's more of a marketing play geared toward inexperienced woodturners. Use what works best and safely for you.

Bigashbowls: If it works for you great! But like cars, varieties of woodturning tools, lathe manufactures there are choices. Choose what works best for you and your style.

Claguewood: I've been using something close to an Ellsworth grind for many years. I love it. Been using a 40/40 now for a few weeks on some things. It's good for those things. Both have a place. If I had only one bowl gouge (heaven forbid) I'd go with Ellsworth. Could be just because I have so much experience and comfort with it.

40/40 Grind: What I don't understand is the negativity associated with Stuart and his methodology. I personally found him to be an excellent teacher and genuine nice guy. He has big dreams but what's wrong with that? I tried other grinds and found it much easier to get consistently the best results and I've worked with many top names brought in by our club, Ellsworth, Jordan, Agar, etc.

Stevethewoodturner: I don't get hung up over angles what ever suits you is safe. Far to much is made of angles many top turners have different opinions. Certainly not a magic bullet. It's the man that makes the tool not the tool that makes the man as my Granddad would drum into me.

Woodworksmisfit: I have a 40/40, an Ellsworth, and a few others. Like many others have said, Safety first and comfort follows. I use all of them for different things. As crazy as it may sound, sometimes the wood just tells me what it likes.

Ashelyharwoodturning: I use the 40/40 on all my spindle turning, including finials as well as bowl turning and everything in between. It can cut into a 90 degree corner, it provides an easier entry into a cut without skidding because the nose bites in first, the straight wing can peel like askew if needed, it cuts the perfect dovetail tenon, the 40 degree bevel angle stays in the groove of a cut easier thant a 50 degree bevel, minimizing bounce and vibration that comes from too much bevel pressure, it can remove a lot of material in a hurry and also provides a fine finish cut. I do not use a bowl gouge for scraping.

Scottedwards81: I find any grind is down to the turner's preference and what suits them better saying one grind is better than another is not based on fact it is based on opinion and opinions vary. It doesn't matter what grind you have if you present the tool to the wood properly you will achieve a good cut. You can sharpen a shovel and use that to turn if you wanted as long as it is presented right it will cut.

Mainkvisit: I don't even know what it means. I just sharpen my tools and turn.

Ken-belanus-woodturner: With M42 Kyro you definitely want the 50/50. Pre-1995 Henry taylor requires a 40/40

My opinion, Imadley above said it best: "Choose a grind, any grind that you can consistently sharpen and use it, make it work for you. None of it is magic. Hi All


