

I hope you are all staying well. We are blessed to have such a wonderful pastime to keep us busy.


Our program schedule will continue to provide a variety of demonstrations to enhance your skills and maybe offer something you haven't tried before..



#### Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are sophisticated and change their tactics frequently and continue with their attacks.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID-19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion!

DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

#### **SDWT will NEVER:**

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.


Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasurer at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

**REMEMBER,** cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

May has been a busy month for TAV and closed out with manning our booth at the Vista Strawberry Festival. Dave John, Sally Ault, Jon Chernow, Steve Frick, Steve Cook and Ruth Cook volunteered and I volunteered too for the day. We were also supported by SDWT members who donated Turned items. As usual, top turning was the biggest draw but we also had a large number of pens that that people were happy to have. Inspite of being blocked off by the caution tape for the race until 9am and a failed generator, our total donations exceeded \$1800, which I believe is the most one-day donations we have collected at an event like this! It was a fun day. Lots of good promotion for SDWT and TAV.

On **May 3rd**, we installed the first 3 Laguna Revo 1216 lathes at Naval Medical Center. I was assisted by Brian Saunders and Nahshon Stark in dismantling 3 Delta lathes and attaching the new lathes to the Delta Stands. Jon

Chernow and I had already prepared mounting boards to attach the lathes to the old stands. We will be ordering 5 more lathes for NMC and install them after the Del Mar Fair. The lathes at NMC are funded by a grant from the San Diego Armed Services YMCA and will have donation plaques stating "DONATED BY SAN DIEGO ARMED SERVICES YMCA". The 3 Delta lathes that were "retired" are now in the shops of 3 SDWT club members in return for a donation of \$250 each. As additional Delta lathes are replaced, more will be offered to club members. Look for club blasts regarding availability.



On May 26 I was an invitee to attend a "fund raising mixer" sponsored by the Hero Program sponsored by Elite and Krank Golf. This is a program that sponsors golf events to support wounded veterans all across the United States. Many of the attendees at the mixer were wounded warriors. I was wearing my TAV polo shirt and interacting with people from other volunteer organizations. I met one triple amputee who said "I know you, you taught me how to turn pens." We talked for about 30 minutes and he asked me about several including Tom Lightner, Nan Bushley and a lady named Alma who worked in Occupational Therapy. I do not specifically remember working with Jose so I am assuming when he said "you" he was referring to TAV and not me personally. Regardless, it was very gratifying to meet someone we helped get through a very difficult time in his life about 12 years ago.

# "Fair Heads-Up Info"

The Del Mar Fair for 2022 is almost upon us (8 June - 4 July 2022). I want to **thank** all who have stepped up to fill the booth shifts so far and who are assisting in setting up our booth. In addition, we want to thank those of you who prepped tops & pens for the Fair. The Fair is a busy time for all concerned and it is important that we put forth the best image possible for the San Diego Woodturners.

One of the most important points we want to make is that it is extremely important that each person who has volunteered to work one or more shifts at the Fair, fulfill their obligation. We do understand that from time to time health issues or other emergencies come up that prevent one from fulfilling a shift. We ask that if an emergency does come up that you let us know (Steve or Jon) as soon as possible so that we have an opportunity to find a substitute. You would also need to get the issued Fair tickets and parking pass to us asap. We need to then notify the Fair of these changes because of security reasons and the fact that we bring in tools.

If this is your first time volunteering you might have questions about what you should bring to your shift. We have tried to keep this simple. You will need to bring your turning tools and personal protective equipment. Please do not bring all of your tools. We are turning small objects and you should bring appropriate tools for **turning tops and pens**.

There is a break room in The Design and Wood Building for us to use. Typically water and soda are provided. The Fair administration has asked us to keep sanding to a minimum. All finishes and child safe felt pens will be provided by our club. We have prepped tops and pen kits for you to turn. Remember to wear protective equipment at all times while you are turning.

**Our main objective is the promotion of the woodturning craft.** However, we do have signage asking for donations for Tops and Pens for our programs that serve Wounded Veterans and serves as a secondary objective. We ask you to arrive about 30 minutes early. Traffic is sometimes a problem and we want you coming relaxed and ready to meet the public.

At the end of each day one of the volunteers will count the donations and take all but \$20.00 (leave the \$20.00 in small bills for the next day) home. This person will be asked to write and mail a check to SDWT (9984 Scripps Ranch #198, San Diego, CA 92131). We will have pre-addressed envelopes at the back of the booth for you to use. Write the date you volunteered on the check so that we can better track the donations coming in.

The parking passes and fair tickets should be arriving at your home mail boxes .Parking for exhibitors is via the **East Stable Gate** (See back of passes for Map/entry point). Our booth is inside the door on the right of the Design in Wood exhibit building. # "Safety Note from AAW"

#### From the AAW Safety Committee

# Fractal Burning Kills; AAW Reiterates the Dangers



The AAW Board, through its Safety Committee, wants to reemphasize the dangers associated with the process known as

Lichtenberg, or "fractal," burning, an embellishing technique that uses high-voltage electrical current to burn patterns on wood. This often unsafe, life-threatening practice has once again surfaced in the news and on social media, following a two-victim incident in April 2022.

In 2017, the AAW Board of Directors voted to ban any fractal-burning demonstrations and equipment sales at AAW-sponsored events. The ban prohibits displaying fractal-burned pieces at any AAW-sponsored event and promoting the practice via articles in AAW publications. Sadly, since the AAW Board adopted its policy on fractal burning in 2017, there have been thirty-three reported deaths directly attributed to fractal burning, and an unknown number of injuries and close calls.

#### **Learn About the Hidden Dangers**

Fractal burning poses a significant hidden risk of electrocution. It speaks volumes that there are no UL-rated fractal burning units commercially available. Many of the YouTube videos that show how to build these devices at home do not adequately address the inherent safety concerns. Many users think they are being safe, but the number of serious injuries and deaths says otherwise.


SDWT Policy Endorsement stated:

# Marathon County couple died by electrocution while making 'fractal burning' wood art

Two people in Marathon County were electrocuted while they were engaging in a wood-art practice called "fractal burning." Their deaths are calling attention to the risks of the practice, which has spread on social media, and which experts say cannot be practiced safely by home woodworkers.

Tanya M. Rodriguez, 44, and James K. Carolfi, 52, were found dead in their rural Marathon County home on April 6 when firefighters responded to a house fire there. The Marathon County Sheriff's Office identified the deaths as "suspicious" and investigated the scene for signs of arson and homicide. Following a weekslong investigation by local authorities and the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratory, on Thursday Chief Deputy Chad Billeb said during a press conference that the two had died in their garage from electrocution by the electric current they were using to burn fractal patterns in wood. The house fire then started as a result of the same current.

"It's a very dangerous process," Billeb said, that involves using jumper cables to run a high-voltage electric current from a disassembled microwave across a piece of wood. "You can see the potential danger that's there, when you're working with something like the power supply to a microwave."

At least 33 people have died as a result of fractal burning, according to the American Association of Woodturners, which has sought to educate people about the extraordinarily high risks of the practice. Those who've died include new hobbyists and experienced woodworkers alike, and even in one case "an electrician with many years of experience working with electricity," according to the AAW's website.

A man in Michigan's Upper Peninsula <u>died in July</u> as a result of the practice. In Wisconsin, a <u>Rock County man died in 2020</u> after he got interested in fractal burning because he had watched videos about it on social media.

There are hundreds of such videos on YouTube, TikTok and other video-sharing sites. They include videos of people who used home microwaves as a power source and others who use a car battery. Some offer cursory safety warnings; some do not.

The intricate patterns burned into the wood as the electric current passes over it can resemble a bolt of lighting or the branches of a tree. They're sometimes called "Lichtenberg figures," and they're observed in other electric discharges, including the scars left on people who are struck by lightning.

Phil McDonald, executive director of the AAW, said the organization adopted a strong recommendation against fractal burning beginning in 2017 after seeing a "proliferation" of social media tutorials instructing people on how to use "extremely high-voltage transformers to create their own home-based fractal burning systems."

"I believe that's probably been the largest contributing source to the individuals who are being injured and dying from this," McDonald said. "The equipment can't be made safely, and the real issue here is that there are not enough safeguards once those home-based systems are built to ensure that they can be operated safely."
