from the Prez . . .

June went by quickly as it was a busy month for SDWT. Particularly so with the Fair preparations - setting up the booth, entries by members, manning our SDWT booth and sharing our passion for woodturning with the public, along with closeout with the take down of the booth and return of lathes and material back to Nottingham. Donations received for Tops and Pens is being tallied (we did well) and we will wait for the official donation amount after Geri and Steve collaborate. From my observations, tops sold well and particularly a highlight to see youngsters spin tops and pick colors.

The darker pens sold more over the lighter wood pens but **Dave John** noted that those pens when describing the wood as Torrey Pine sold quite well. Some of our specialty pens (not 7m) but other brands sold. Some inquiry for fountain pens were made and we did have a few in our specialty pen box that sold (donation). Something for next year maybe. Remaining Top blanks, I recall when speaking with Steve, that we do have on hand but we will need to start the process again to regain our inventory and have turned Tops on-hand for next year. We may see some new members who made inquiry as a result of our collective shared stories of what SDWT is all about.

One Fair side note- Don Wolfe was maning a lathe in the SDWT booth and turning. A gentleman stepped up and started talking with him. Come to learn he was the First President of SDWT- **Mr Richard Griebe** (pic R) as well as one of the Founders of SDWT. Don got his phone number and I gave Richard a call the next day to Thank him for stopping by the booth and hoped he was enjoying the Fair and seeing all the turned items that were on display. He reminisced on the start of SDWT and it evolved around getting entries into the Fair. He was told to get an entry in you needed to belong to a group. So he and other Founders who had an interest in woodturning at the time started SDWT and got together. The following year turned items were submitted. He spoke highly of Nan Bushley who he said was a go getter and great demonstrator. He liked turning green wood and olive wood. He was fascinated by the turnings he saw today that were on display and far above what they were doing back in the day. Anyway an interesting conversation and opportunity to meet the first president of SDWT. I also extended an invite to him to any of our meetings.



Concurrently during June, TAV continued with some members doing both the fair and TAV. We Thank You for your dedication and time. Along with the Fair and TAV activities, a demonstration by Mike Jackofsky along with a follow-on class kept SDWT busy. Again, a Thank You to Mike for his patience and adjustments made in schedule.

Looking Ahead:

July is looking to be a busy month as well and to bring to your attention a couple of activities:

Reminder to All SDWT Members



Beginning in 2018, cybercriminals attacked SDWT club officers by using information obtained from our website. Since we have removed contact information from the public areas of our website and increased fraud awareness, these attacks have subsided. However, these criminals are sophisticated and change their tactics frequently and continue with their attacks.

In addition to direct attacks against our club, new scams are being reported involving tax filing delays, tax refunds, Social Security, the Census, COVID-19 Economic Impact Checks, and COVID-19. These scams involve phishing emails, robocalls and even people coming to our homes to sell non-existent vaccinations, medicines and tests. Be vigilant! Maintain a high level of suspicion!

DO NOT RESPOND TO ROBOCALLS OR CLICK LINKS THAT YOU DO NOT RECOGNIZE!

We must all have a high level of suspicion concerning any request for money, gift cards, banking information, credit card information, PayPal information, crypto currency, etc. and always keep our guard up!

SDWT will NEVER:

Send an email asking anyone to send or email gift cards or cryptocurrency.

Send an email asking for money or payment, **EXCEPT** for a class that you have signed up for, and then only send a check for the fee to the treasurer at our club's address. SDWT will never ask for gift cards or cryptocurrency to pay for classes.

PayPal is used for membership, and for donations.

REMEMBER, cyber criminals are very sophisticated and even the experts can be fooled!

If in doubt, ALWAYS call the treasurer, president or a club officer using the contact information found in the Members Only section of the SDWT website!

June was a fairly normal month with regards to TAV instruction at all three sites. With summer now in full swing, it seems the number of participants varies week to week but our services are still appreciated. Many of our volunteers have also been manning the SDWT booth at the Del Mar Fair. That is great opportunity for us to demonstrate our woodturning skills to the public and educate them about TAV. The people are fun to interact with. They provide very positive feedback and many have interesting stories about their time in the service. Personally, I got to spend about 20 minutes talking with a 96 year old World War 2 veteran who has been coming to the fair every year and fully supports our efforts with TAV.

I have placed another order for Laguna lathes. They are on back order but should arrive in late July. They will be installed at NMC and then I will order more for the Wounded Warrior Barracks, Camp Pendleton. Several people have expressed an interest in obtaining the used Delta 46-460 lathes. They will be offered for a \$250 donation to SDWT/TAV. The lathes will not have stands. They will include drive centers, live centers and tool rests. I have started a spreadsheet to track people who are interested. Please send me a text or email if you are interested.

Prior to the opening of the Del Mar Fair, Tom Lightner was interviewed as one of the local heroes who contribute so much to the San Diego community. Portions of his interview were included in the video that is played in the paddock area. Tom explained the TAV program and emphasized assistance we have provided to over 11,000 service personnel since we began providing woodturning lessons at Naval Medical Center in 2007. Tom's passion for our program and his continuing commitment to our service members is an inspiration we all share.

Long time SDWT member and TAV volunteer Jack Henz moved to Northern California in June. He called me to say he had five canes made from Diamond Willow that Tom Lightner had obtained from friends in Wisconsin. The canes have been donated to the Charitable Giving liaison at Wounded Warrior Barracks. I have requested pictures of people who receive them. Jack and his wife are getting settled into their new home, closer to their children and grand kids.

Every month I remind people that we need new (maybe younger) volunteers to keep TAV going. We also need turned items that we offer for donations when we set up a booth at events like the Vista Strawberry Festival last month and for the Torrey Pines Gift Shop. Please see me at the July meeting if you have turned item donations or want to volunteer.

A Week with **Matt Monaco** at Craft Supplies USA, Provo,UT

Editorial Note: The below article is provided from SDWT member Richard Larimore, who attended a week long class with Matt Monaco at the Dale Nish School of Woodturning at CraftSupplyUSA during June. I asked Rich if he could do a short write-up of his candid observations and general thoughts on the class that was presented. Thanks to Rich for taking the time to help introduce Matt and share a few candid observations. Matt will be visiting SDWT in Aug and holding a two day class.

Observations by Richard Larimore on a recent class with Matt Monaco

“Well, this is something I never thought I would be asked to do....write an article for our club’s newsletter.”

I had attended a 5 day signature class with Matt Manaco. and I was asked to give my opinion of the class and Matt Manaco.

I have taken classes by Nick Cook, Mike Jackofsky, Kirk Deheer and others. the bar was set pretty high I had not heard about Matt and didn't know if I wanted to spend my money on an "unknown". Matt is known for his thin walled bowls, boxes with details, bowls and platters. he trained under Richard Raffaen for many years.

The first thing we did was turn a few thin walled bowls. I was nervous as I had never turned one and I usually stop long before it is thin because I didn't know the technique to properly do it. His patience and ability to explain the process on my level made for an enjoyable experience. I won't try to explain the process but these are a couple of my bowls done there and when I got home. I hope you will attend Matt's class in August, I know I have already reserved my space. He also has us do beading detail with a spindle gouge.. Easier said than done.

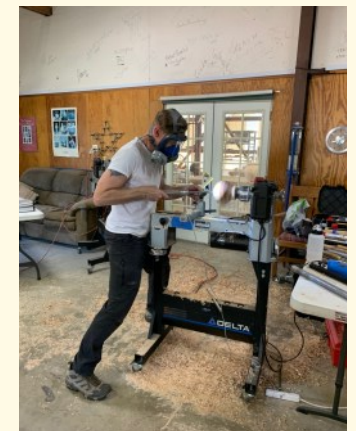
Matt is very technical in regards to explaining how to achieve the best cuts in relationship to grain in the wood. Whether to use a scraper.push or pull cut and more..

I would have to say he is a professional woodturner, has high standards, ability to communicate on a students level of experience and lots of PATIENCE.

His detail work with the skew is amazing to watch. I did learn a person can get a better cut slowing the lathle down when taking a final cut.

I hope I have portrayed Matt Monaco class is worth the time and expense. You will not be disappointed. I am eagerly looking forward to attending his two day class in August.

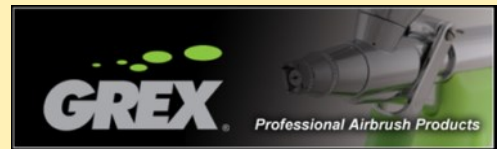
