COVID: If you have been following recent news, COVID cases have been on the rise in San Diego County and public health (PH) officials warning of a potential surge as we approach the fall time frame. SD County is in the “High” Community activity level. Many of our members are in the age group where COVID is a very serious health risk. Your SDWT Board members have been following the matter closely and at our recent Board Meeting discussed the current status. Our guidance to date essentially remains unchanged for those fully vaccinated (masks optional), and those unvaccinated to remain home and watch our program via ZOOM.

However, for those vaccinated and attending our Aug regular meeting at Nottingham, the Board Strongly Recommends masks when indoors such as in our meeting room at Nottingham. This guidance aligns with County PH official information on wearing of masks that “strongly recommends but does not require in indoor public settings...” in SD County.

Our demonstrator (inside Nottingham) is exempt in order that we can understand him/her better vice hindered by a mask during the demonstration. If you come to the meeting and want to be unmasked and not inside the meeting room, the safest alternative for all concerned is to be seated in the patio/outside area and watch the demonstration via our outside video monitor. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Our Demonstration this Month: Our program event this month is a demonstration on bowl turning and skew techniques by Matt Monaco (see page 4). This is a **paid demonstration** that a charge of \$25 dollars members and \$35 dollars Non-Members (includes lunch) for In-Person attendees. This is the same price we have charged in the past for our paid professional turning demonstrations.

There is nothing like attending an in-person demonstration to learn turning technique and skills directly and to have an opportunity to ask questions during the presentation and breaks to interact and meet these professional and noted demonstrators in woodturning. We are fortunate to have the variety of demonstrations that we have in our Program, annually put together by Sally, to help all levels of turners in SDWT. I hope you can attend. Post demonstration video access will be made available to our in-person paid attendees via our Members Only Area of our Website.

New to our program is our ability to “Live” ZOOM presentations and record. However, to contribute to the cost associated with paid demonstrators for our August program and ZOOM cost, **a charge of \$20 is required and one must register** to attend the ZOOM live presentation. To register we will be using a temporary e-commerce site of one of our members (Joe Fleming-AIRBRUSHINGWOOD.com) who has been gracious in helping the club in this administrative matter while we seek a more permanent venue to handle paid demonstrations. Details on registration is forthcoming in an e-blast from our Webmaster (Roy Ulrich) who will outline the steps to follow. Similarly, as with the in-person attendees, post demonstration video access will be made available to those who register via our Members Only Area of our Website. Be sure to register prior to the 20th of August for live ZOOM access.

Accordingly, be on the look out for an E-Blast on steps to register if you're attending via ZOOM for this months demonstration with Matt Monaco.

Drop-in-Saturday

Sadly, there is No Drop in Saturday for August. Volunteers are needed for set-up/clean-up and mentorship if this event is to happen. We have one member who has stepped up to offer help but two to three additional members are required if we are to make this event happen. Let me know or any of your board members of your interest. A robust team of volunteers are needed to set up and operate the equipment and internet connection during meetings. We cannot expect 2 or 3 people to be able to operate the equipment at all meetings. Turn Around for Veterans (TAV)



Turn Around for Vets (TAV) is a critical program of the San Diego Woodturners Club. All TAV activities are carried out by a dedicated, unpaid group of volunteers so that 100% of donated funds, designated for TAV, are used to purchase supplies and equipment and to support the program.

After the Del Mar Fair closed in early July and the club dismantled our booth, TAV returned to a fairly routine schedule teaching woodturning to service members and veterans at all three sites. We received our second shipment of Laguna Revo 1216 lathes on July 21. Jon Chernow and Paul Simpson prepared and installed mounting boards on each of these lathes on July 28 and installed 2 of them at the Wounded Warrior Barracks that afternoon. The other four lathes will be installed at NMC on August 4, which completes the replacement there. Eight additional lathes are on order and will be delivered in early August. They will complete the transition to new lathes at Wounded Warrior Barracks and provide two new lathes at Aspire.

Mid July I was informed by Chaplain Bell, our point of contact at Wounded Warrior Barracks, that a new policy is being implemented so that personnel assigned to the barracks will have Wednesdays dedicated to non-therapy, volunteer assistance to the Marines. Several of these organizations, including TAV, have experienced low turn out at times. TAV will set up at 0930 and provide instruction from 10am to 11 am for one group of participants and another session from 1pm to 2pm. Participants will be required to sign in during these sessions for accountability purposes. They will also have the option to participate during their lunch hours from 11am to 1pm. This is similar to the way we have been working on Tuesdays and Thursdays but reflects more command support for participation in our program.

Recent msg from former member Jim Young: Jim Young, was an active member of San Diego Woodturners starting in 1988 through 2016. He was very active in TAV from our start in 2007. Jim and his wife moved to Nebraska where he started a similar program, Veterans for Recovery, through the University of Nebraska, at Innovation Studio, a makerspace for the university and surrounding communities. Tom Lightner provided assistance to get the VA to buy into the program. They have served over 370 veterans, and made approx. 5000 pens in the last 4 years. Jim has volunteered to donate pens to TAV. I have thanked him for the offer and told him we are currently short on pens due to our recent success at the Del Mar Fair. It is always nice to get positive, supportive feedback from people like Jim. If you would like to read a little more about his history, there is an article written by Don Owen in the archived SDWT newsletter for May 2016 in the Members Only section of our website.
