Anyway, give it a try and embellish a piece of wood to hold your badge.

If you attended last month's meeting and viewed the Instant Gallery Table, there was quite a few pieces of your work that you all have been working on (See the Instant Gallery of Items on page 16 of this news letter). Compliments to all who brought in items. Ernesto expresses his appreciation as well. Speaking of Instant Gallery, Ernesto introduced two turning challenges on turning chessman and trompo's, a couple of spindle turning projects. This month is focusing on Pawns. See page 23 and 24 on Ernesto's Instant Gallery Challenge. So break out the spindle gouges and give these two projects a go and bring to the next instant gallery. Ernesto will be collecting each month in order to fill out the chess board and collection of trompo's. Be creative!!

Also, weed pots brought in at our last meeting were great. Keep them coming. All weed pots are donated to Lumbercycle and in-turn SDWT is supported with wood resources. One side note: Tom has asked that in your design of your weed pots when turning, if you could consider adding the ability to insert a candle holder (tea lights) in some. These are approx 1" or so in diameter and half inch in depth.

3 February, Steve Frick began issuing out top material to make top wafers with dowel insert. We had about a half dozen members show up at Dan White's shop to pick-up material to begin prepping top blanks. Steve will have additional material at our February meeting to issue out. We need top blanks made and some tops turned to help in preparation for this years Del Mar Fair. Consider pick-ing some material up to lend a hand. Steve will have more information on our preparations at our February meeting.

In addition, San Diego Fine Woodworkers has posted on their website information regarding Design in Wood for 2023. Information regarding entry of pieces for the Design in Wood display at the Fair and key dates is on page 21 of this NL. Key date is **28 April** for submission of your entry which is done on-line. For the on-line entry form see SDFWA.COM (Design In Wood Tab) for your entry form. Again, submitted on-line followed by delivery of your item to Del Mar on May 23rd. Good Luck and I encourage all in SDWT to enter a piece. You are all doing some fine work given the items displayed at our Instant Gallery.

Our Torrey Pine Reserve Gift Shop via TAV continues to need Torrey Pine turned items, Small bowls and the like for festivals forthcoming, Weed Pots for Lumbercycle. ## Turn Around for Veterans (TAV)



Turn Around for Vets (TAV) is a critical program of the San Diego Woodturners Club. All TAV activities are carried out by a dedicated, unpaid group of volunteers so that 100% of donated funds, designated for TAV, are used to purchase supplies and equipment and to support the program.

In spite of the rain, TAV was able to open as scheduled at all 3 sites in January. We have been encouraging participants to expand their skills from pen-making and spindle-turning projects to bowls. One of the Marines at Wounded Warrior Battalion has a friend with access to cut-offs from a custom door-making shop and may be able to provide some that are big enough for 6 to 8 inch bowls. I am investigating some other options in addition to our club wood supply.

On January 27 I met with the curator of the Sacred Canyons and Rare Trees: Torrey Pines exhibit at the La Jolla Historical Society's "Wisteria Gallery". The address for the gallery is 780 Prospect Avenue, La Jolla. The display will be open February 10 through May 26. Six items were selected for the display:





First Bowl

The display will be on a pedestal with a protective cover and a plaque describing San Diego Woodturners, Turn Around for Veterans and how we re-purpose Torrey Pine. When the exhibit closes, I will pick up our items and return them to the artists.



Items to be on display include a deep platter by Larry Szafraniec. Two decorated bowls by Ray Brooks.

A natural edge bowl; (I am not sure of the artist). a hollow form bowl and a Torrey Pine pen

The docents were extremely happy to get them because they had completely run our of our turned items by New Years Day. They are donating over \$500 to TAV. They will be needing more inventory in a couple of months so please keep the Torrey Pine items coming; I will take donations at club meetings.

Honorary SDWT Member Tyler Smith is opening his new business, *Crossed Cannons Wood Working*, in Glenwood, Minnesota on February 1st. He has some local veterans who are woodworkers who will provide some of the inventory on a consignment basis. Tyler was interviewed by the Pope County Tribune and made the front



page. He intends to provide woodturning lessons in addition to selling his wares (See the story on page 8 from the Pope County Tribune).

We still need volunteers to join TAV. Contact me if you are interested. We also need turned items including pens, tops, spindle work and bowls made of any type of wood for our club booth at the Vista Strawberry Festival May 28<sup>th</sup>

## "Woodwork store, shop opens in Glenwood"

"Glenwood has recently been blessed with another unique new shopping experience. Crossed Cannon Wood Works, a combination shop and workshop, has opened on First Avenue. Tyler Smith, owner and creator of the store, has been doing woodturning for several years now and had been looking for a way to share his talents and story with others.

Smith hails from southern Oregon. He joined the military in 1999 and served 21 and a half years in the U.S. Navy going on nine deployments to 51 countries. His wife Megan, also a U.S. Navy veteran, is from North Dakota and they have



a 14 year-old son. "We visited a friend on Honorary SDWT member and former TAV team member –Tyler Smith Lake Darling three or four years ago and

Lake Darling three or four years ago and fell in love with the area," said Smith.

Originally Smith was interested in small engine repair, but it wasn't long before he shifted gears and started turning wood. "My father-in-law taught me how to turn wood in the summer of 2018. He taught me how to make a pen and I realized that this is therapy for me. The world disappears when you watch the wood spin into the next creation, Smith expressed. His talent has grown from pens into bowls, calls, containers and event hats.

The point of Crossed Cannon Wood Works is finding "beauty from within," he stated. "I enjoy working with wood with imperfections. Wormholes, burls, rotten parts, they all create a unique piece."

Smith was stationed in San Diego when he found several other woodturners. "They asked if I wanted to join their club and after I was over the shock of a club existing, I said yes. That club has some of the best woodturners in the United States, and I learned from them."

"I've taught a lot of people to turn wood, but I really enjoy teaching veterans because I can relate to them," he stated. Smith has taught people that struggle with PTSD, physical disabilities and mental disabilities. "I taught a friend who cannot stand at a lathe to turn wood from his wheelchair. I have a friend with no arms that turns wood with her feet. It's therapeutic for them. For an hour they can forget their trauma and just focus on wood turning."

Smith's plans for his business have several aspects. Within the next year, he wants to start offering classes on basic woodturning and creating bowls and pens. In the next few years, he'd like to work with rehabilitation seekers on learning a new skill and building confidence. He has retail items for sale and some unique pieces on display that are not for sale. He also is open to taking limited custom orders.

He really looks forward to sharing his creativity with the people of Pope County, but as you can tell, he has an interesting story too. "I just want people to come in and enjoy the art of woodturning. There are so many trees here an we see the bark, branches and leaves, but I can show people what trees are like from the inside and what they can be. It truly is art," he shared. "Plus it smells really good most of the time."


Dimensions below are a general guide to follow.

This month's focus is on turning pawn's (white and dark).











# **Mentoring Program**


