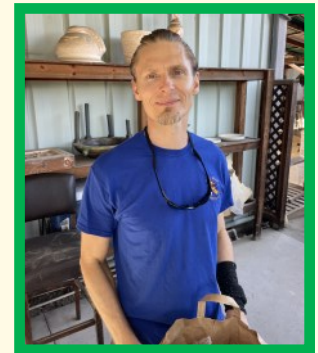

This **Month**: **Oneway Coring with Wet Wood (an Intuitive approach)**. By **Chad La Voi**,

In this demo, I will cover the following topics:

- A quick review of wall thickness and drying concepts.
- Explanation of cutters and their impact on maintaining consistent wall thickness.
- Proper base setup.
- Introduction to the Hunter Korpro Cutter.
- Ensuring consistent wall thickness for all cores, focusing on the 3rd and 4th cores.
- Modifications for accessing tight spots.
- Re-chucking dry bowls.



There are at least two ways to set up your coring system for repeatable coring. Oneway supplies a video that comes with the system, but it seems overly complicated and reliant on identical blanks (which are hard to find). So, I chose the simpler approach. I want to share what I've learned so you can maximize your output and, most importantly, have an absolute blast in the process! Coring is not just a technique, it's an enjoyable experience!

One important factor to consider is the relationship of each cutter's offset, how they differ, and how you achieve a third and fourth core with a "thicker" consistent wall thickness throughout the entire bowl. A necessity when you want that core set to last through the drying process! I don't want to make you watch me core the entire time, but I would like to core a bowl to demonstrate some pitfalls to watch out for and to show the Korpro cutter in action.

I want to demonstrate at least two methods for rechucking and show how I finish the bowl; after it is dry (not finishing). I'm hoping to expand the design possibilities and inspire people to think outside of the bowl. By making slight modifications to your support arms, you can create alternative arcs that maximize the potential of the accessible blanks. This could open up a whole new world of possibilities for creating boxes, lidded bowls with cores inside, and more. The sky's the limit when it comes to your creativity in woodturning! I'm here to encourage and support your journey into the exciting world of woodturning design.

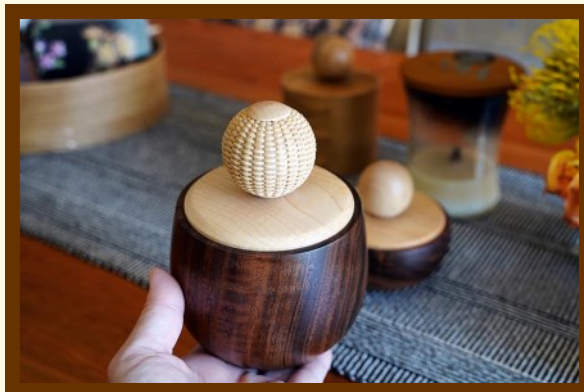

Well, the 2024 Del Mar Fair is over and I hope everyone had a lot of fun. I know I did. I got to see Jay Leno, Little Big Town, and The Village People. Imagine that, it's 2024 and The Village People are still playing concerts. I have to admit that I was never a fan but that little mini concert was free and it was a lot of fun.

Regarding the Design in Wood Exhibition, I wanted to commend all the club members who entered a project at the Fair. I know it can be a little daunting to put your name on a project and put it out for thousands of people to see. But it is these projects, that demonstrate the creativity and craftsmanship of the woodworker, that makes the Design in Wood Exhibition one of the best woodworking exhibitions in the country. So, keep up the good work.

By the way, the San Diego Woodturners were well represented in the Design in Wood Exhibition's winner's circle. The following members won awards and/or honorable mentions: Chad La Voi (HM, HM, HM), Sally Ault (3rd), Pete Campbell (1st, 1st, 3rd), Ralph Crowther (4th), Greg Hogan (4th), Mike Jackofsky (1st, 2nd, 4th), Jeff Neff (HM, HM), Peter Sidlauskas (HM, HM), Larry Stafranick (4th), Bryan Thompson (1st,4th) and Curt Yaws (3rd, HM, HM). Congratulations to all.

Tops and pens were in high demand this year. Sales (donation) were so brisk that by mid-Fair, I was concerned that we would run out of tops before it was over. Luckily we made it thru and by the end of the Fair, we went through over 2,300 tops. This amount almost doubled the amount of tops we used in each of the previous two years. Total donations came in at a little over **\$19,600** which surpassed last year's donations by about \$3,400.

So, it was a good year but it wouldn't have been possible without all the help from our club members. I want to take this opportunity to thank all those folks who helped in the booth, those who worked behind the scenes to make tops and pens, and all the prep work that goes with it. Every pen and top made and every hour worked in the booth was important and it was appreciated.

SDWT 2024 Del Mar Fair “Wrap-Up”



I especially want to thank those folks who went above and beyond what was expected. I hesitate to list those people's names because I'm sure I'll mistakenly leave someone of the list that should be on it. But I'm going to do it anyway. In any case, here it goes;

- Brian Sanders, Brian lead the club by working 12 shifts in the booth, Mike Tompkins and Sally Ault both worked 8 shifts, Jon Chernow worked 7 shifts and Nashon Stark and Jerry Ela both worked 6 shifts.

- Larry Williams turned hundreds of tops, I believe it was in the 400 to 500 range,
- Fred Thompson made hundreds of pen blanks,
- Honorary Member, John Mulcahy, from Lincoln, Nebraska, donated all the premium (acrylic) pens. I believe it was about 150 pens,
- Ernesto Aquino organized the making of the pens and getting all the supplies,
- Norm Burkhart set up the Square device,
- Jon Chernow helped out in every phase of the process from booth setup to tear down and beyond. Jon was the guy that called you to remind you of your upcoming shifts,

- And finally Ray Brooks. Ray made well over 1,000 top blanks and turned over 700 tops for the Fair. If you go outside and hear a spinning sound, it's probably Ray turning a top.

Lets Pause and Talk Safety

(Source: AAW Book "Safety for Woodturners")

A few Important Safety Reminders for Woodturning:

- Always wear safety goggles or safety glasses. Use a full face shield for bowl, vessel, or anything involving chucks and faceplates. Use a combination of dust helmet, mask, air helmet, proper ventilation, and/or dust collection system as appropriate.
- Wear hearing protection during extended periods of turning.
- Turn the lathe off before adjusting the tool rest or tool base, i.e., banjo.
- Always remove chuck keys, adjusting wrenches, and knockout bars immediately after use.
- When using a faceplate, be certain the work piece is solidly mounted sheet metal with stout screws (#10 or #12 sheet metal screws as a minimum). Do not use dry wall or deck screws.
- When turning between centers, be certain the workpiece is firmly mounted between the headstock driving center and tailstock center.
- Ensure the belt guard or cover is in place.
- Check that all locking devices on the tailstock and tool rest assembly (rest and base) are tight before operating the lathe. Rotate your workpiece backwards and forward by hand to make sure it clears the tool rest and bed before turning the lathe on.
- Ensure the blank is securely fastened.
- Stay clear of the areas directly behind and in front of the workpiece as they are the most likely areas for a piece to travel as it comes off the lathe
- Always check the speed of the lathe before turning it on. Use slower speeds for large diameters or rough pieces and higher for speeds for smaller diameters and pieces that are balanced. Start the piece at a slow speed until the piece is balanced. If the lathe is vibrating or shaking, lower the speed. If the workpiece vibrates, always stop the machine to verify why.
- Hold turning tools on the tool rest, holding the tool in a controlled but comfortable manner. Always contact the tool rest with the tool before contacting the wood (Remember: Anchor, Bevel, Cut).
- Know your own capabilities and limitations
- Don't overreach, keep proper footing, and keep your balance at all times.
- Keep tools sharp and clean for better and safer performance. Don't force a dull tool. Don't use a tool for a purpose for which it was not designed or intended.
- Stay alert and never leave a lathe unattended

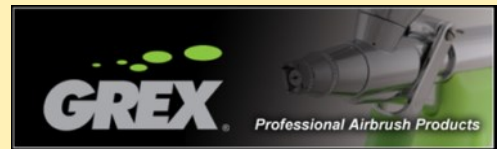
